Maybe a few *suggested* background readings aimed at giving more context to student who have no experience or background in military/national security.

The topics are overall scattered. I dont think they are well-connected to the overarching theme of military effectiveness. If I could restructure the sections, I will do them this way: 1. Presenting a topic (Space security) 2. Why is it relevant? What is the history of this topic? 3. Current incidents and events that are related to the topic. Some sections are already shaped this way, but still.
